This ethnoprimateological field school provides students the opportunity to study free-ranging long-tailed macaques (*Macaca fascicularis*) at the Ubud Monkey Forest located in Bali, Indonesia. The site is a ~800 year old Hindu temple complex situated on a tropical rainforest fragment within the village of Ubud. Students will learn skills in the method and theory of both primatology and cultural anthropology, requisite for understanding human-macaque interfaces. Participants will gain insights into human and nonhuman primate behavior and learn how humans and wildlife co-exist on shared landscapes. As a field school, we will live with a Balinese family and engage in local cultural activities resulting in a truly experiential learning opportunity.
